## The Bluebell Inn - part 6



In 1982 John and Dorothy Schuller purchased the pub as a Free House and quickly revived its fortunes without resorting to serving food. The Schuller's revamped the interior with new windows to lighten the lounge and a pool area at the rear of the 'tap' room, once part occupied by a stairwell and Shirley's grill!

Throughout this extract we have talked of the 'The Blue Bell'. Quite when it added a bluebell floral motif to any inn sign is unclear. At one time there was a small bell on the corner bracket on the frontage. One of the 1920-30's inn sign simply named it 'The Bell'.
