

## Edgar Tomblin — Part 1

Many of you would have known Adrian Tomblin who sadly passed away in 2017. Adrian's father, Edgar Tomblin, decided to put on paper his childhood memories of Lound together with the village tales and legends related to him and by his father, Alfred Tomblin.

From 1875 onwards many events would be in the personal memory of Albert Tomblin and from 1915 onwards could be recollected by Edgar. Prior to these dates 'oral history' has to be relied upon.

Memories do give a feel for rural life in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. It is impossible not to admire the resilience and tenacity shown by the farmers, workers and smallholders and sense the 'working together' attitude of the villagers. Lound has always had a reputation for producing more than its share of colourful characters, even eccentrics. 

## Neighbourhood Plan



### THE LOUND NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN AND THE NEW PLANNING ENVIRONMENT

Under the emerging National Planning Policy Framework and Bassetlaw District Council's (BDC) Local Development Plan, the status of Lound and similar rural settlements will be radically changed. In the place of previous protections against development, Lound will now be set a target to build **20** new homes between now and 2035. This is to help BDC meet its contribution of new homes to the national requirement.

Our Neighbourhood Plan, which will shortly be available in draft form, will set out your wishes that **13** new homes be built over the next **16** years. The Plan will show the sites, styles and designs which you have indicated through the various Surveys and Consultations and which have been discussed with the landowners. The Lound Design Code has been added to the village website. ((See—*Consultation and Public Notices*))

There are currently **3** planning permissions for new homes in progress and these will count towards our target. This would leave the parish with capacity to approve an additional **4** residential properties under what is called a "windfall" policy with their position and design still strictly controlled by the Neighbourhood Plan.

**We cannot stress highly enough the need for you to support the Lound Plan to ensure Planning Officers have a legal document by which they can regulate future planning permissions to meet our wishes.**

A presentation has been arranged in Lound Village Hall on **Tuesday 12th February 2019** between 4.00pm and 8.00pm hosted by BDC Planning Officers and your Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group. You will be able to discuss issues raised by the BDC draft Local Plan and view how the Neighbourhood Plan will be used to manage future planning applications. You are cordially invited to attend.
