## Linghurst / Lakes - part 4

Following sand and gravel extraction and restoration, Linghurst was divided into two basic areas, the Northern Lake and the Southern Lake.

The Northern Lake managed as a conservation area and shaped water body to create a maximum shoreline and the largest area of shallow water. An island to provide the ideal habitat for natural colonisation by wetland species. The Southern and largest lake restored with scalloped edges and islands to attract a variety of wildlife.

Consultation with Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust and Lound Parish Council discounted the need for an adjacent car park and that access should be on foot only for villagers. Plans to have a car park off Chainbridge Lane (next to Poplar Walk) was also dismissed.

During restoration, many thousands of high quality deciduous trees were planted with the intention that these could be harvested in years to come to provide essential revenue for the Lakes maintenance.
