

Lound Archive — part 1

Lound is a Scandinavian name, being the modern form of the old Norse 'Lund' a term denotes a wood or grove. Some indicate it may be a copse in which pagan rites were celebrated.

The name is common and there are several instances in Nottinghamshire, such as Haughton Lound, Northlund at Blyth, Eastlund at Trowell and perhaps Birkland of which the suffix has become perverted into 'land'. Until far into the 13th century this village constantly occurs in records as Lound juxta Mattersey and sometimes as Lound upon Idle. Fortunately, for its inhabitants it lies more than a mile from that once badly-flooding river, and its sandy soil preserved it from becoming an unproductive marsh.

More commonly, the village is referred to in records, old and new, under the compound name of Sutton-cum-Lound, Sutton being the larger of the two, but unfortunately, the annals of both villages are so intermixed that it is difficult to distinguish between them.

The point has been reached where Lound residents now have the opportunity to have their say on which specific sites should be taken forward to the next stage.

In the Residents' Survey of 2016 parishioners suggested 23 sites in and around the village which might be suitable for development to provide new homes.

These have been assessed and 9 of the original sites remain; it is your views on these which are now being sought.

During the first week of June all households will receive an information sheet on this process and more background information will be placed on the village website.

Two drop-in consultation events are planned in the Village Hall on **Saturday 16th June from 11am to 2pm** and on **Thursday 5th July from 5pm to 8pm**, where there will be the opportunity to learn more about each site and to give us your views, either at the meetings or by returning forms later on.

A New Group of Parishes to be Formed



For the last seven years the 27 Parishes of the Retford Area have worked together in the Retford

Area Team Ministry.

Eighteen months ago a review of the Parishes in the team began. This was to consider how best to serve all the people living in the Area and care for the Churches. It is envisaged that the Team Ministry will be reconfigured and smaller groups of churches formed into new benefices.

There will be three Rural Groups of 7 or 8 Parishes each with their own full-time Vicar and the Town Churches will be reorganised.

All Hallows, Ordsall and St Bartholomew's, Sutton cum Lound share a Vicar, at the moment. This is Revd. Sue Caddy.

From July 2018, St Bartholomew's and All Hallows will move into separate working groups. St Bartholomew's will be joining with; Babworth with Ranby, Scofton with Osberton, Elkesley, Eaton and Gamston, Bothamsall and West Drayton. A new Vicar is being sought to serve this group of parishes.

All Hallows will join with St Michael's, West Retford to become one Parish. Revd. Sue Caddy will be the Vicar of this new Parish.

Please pray for the people of St Bartholomew's, the Parishes in the Retford Area as we embark on these new relationships.

Revd. Sue Caddy will honour any Baptism and Wedding arrangements up to the 4th August 2018. Her responsibilities as a School Governor will end at that time. Revd Sue's last Service at St Bartholomew's will be Sunday, 8th July at 9.30am.
