

Lound Archive — part 2

The earliest known documentary reference to Lound dates back to 986 when like Sutton it formed part of King Edwy's large grant of lands to Oskytel, Archbishop of York. By 992 both villages were incorporated among the permanent possessions of the archbishopric and by the time of the Norman Conquest, Sutton and its dependencies, of which Lound was one, had attained some importance. The archbishop was then the largest proprietor, his Sutton manor (*estate or territorial unit*) included land in Lound, Barnby Moor and Scrooby.

Together, they were taxed in 1066 at £8 - no small sum in those days and as Scrooby Palace was not in being, the Archbishops regarded Sutton-cum-Lound as their chief manor in the district.

The royal manor at Bothamsall also had land at Lound and Barnby Moor. A manor which Ulchel had under the Confessor, was granted to Roger de Busli who was ranked one of the foremost men and land owner in Nottinghamshire.

The Village Hall was filled close to its capacity, as residents studied the information on show, asked questions and joined in lively discussions.

If you did not attend this meeting, all is not lost as a second consultation session is arranged for **Thursday 5th July from 5.00pm to 8.00pm**.

Don't miss the opportunity to come along and express your opinions. Once decisions are taken without you, it may be too late for your views to count.

Please take a look at the village website, where documents from the meeting have been published. You will see that Landowners of sites NP12, NP18 and NP19 have set out their thoughts on how they would intend their land to be used. All forms must be returned by the closing date of 12 July.

Once again the importance of having a Neighbourhood Plan (and therefore controlled development) must be stressed. Without a plan, developers or landowners could build without any regard for the village or its residents.

Finally, please remember that all the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group meetings are open for Parishioners to attend and to join in the debates.


