

The Walter Family-Part 3


The butchery business was now very successful and August Walter built a further four new houses in March Street and twelve terraced houses in Willow Street, Conisbrough.

Caroline and Margret Hornüng, sisters of Sophia, joined the family on the opening of the new shop. Caroline to help in the home and roast pork and make cheek stock etc. Margret made pork pies and looked after the original shop at the bottom of the steep hill. So steep, the shop was often



crashed into by cyclist or speeding vehicles.

Both shops being very busy with long hours 9.00am-10.00pm and 11.00pm on Saturday. August Walter went to Doncaster market on Tuesdays to buy 10-14 pigs, taking them home to be slaughtered and cut up the following day.



Although August Walter was of German birth he had been a British subject for several years. However, when war broke out there was much hatred against anyone of German origin. Miners at the nearby Mexborough pit attacked and smashed houses and shops of such people. The Walter shops were also smashed and raided. Eventually, to keep safe, the family had to take refuge in the bank house. This vandalism showed a poor appreciation of the times when the same miners were on strike (*no strike pay*) and August Walter had fed their children twice a day with nourishing meaty soup and bread. In sadness and bitterness, the Walter family left their home and flourishing business. They stayed for while at the Danum Hotel, Doncaster and eventually rented a house in Mathersey ('*Stone House*').

Lound Neighbourhood Plan



Results of the Regulation 14 Consultation

- * A total of 68 responses were received to the consultation
- * 15 of these were from statutory consultees and interested parties
- * The remaining 53 replies were from Residents, representing the views of 86 people

The following table reflects the views of these Residents within six broad categories:
