## Parish Council

### >Flower Planters:

Six octagonal planters have now arrived and ready for positioning around the village. They are self watering with a unique capillary action wick so require minimal maintenance.

### >Hive Aggregates Meeting:

Over 70 people attended the Village Hall on Tuesday 25th October when representatives from Hive Aggregates responded to the many questions raised regarding the proposed local PFA extraction.

It was reported, following village concern, that there will no longer be any through traffic, or, any activity from the Temporary Optimization Site adjacent to Sutton Grange. All PFA material will be sent via an enclosed conveyor direct to Bellmoor. After PFA treatment, it will be transported to end customers from Bellmoor via tankers, onto the A638 road.

Details of the planning application is expected early in the New Year.
