The  $\pounds 50$  prize was rolled over to next month when  $\pounds 150$ will be the big prize.

Due to the higher running costs to maintain your Village Hall, the committee has decided to increase the ticket price from £20 to £25.

The £20 ticket price was set back in 2005 when the draw was known as the '125 Club'. With village interest, ticket sales went up and the draw then became known as the '135 Club' with the prize money split between 4 winners plus the £50 premium prize as we have today.

In 2009 the monthly prize money changed to 4 winners of  $\pounds 20$  each plus the  $\pounds 50$  premium prize. The name was then changed to 'Four Score Draw'. This means the ticket price has not changed for 18 years!

With the change in the ticket price, the prize money will increase to  $\pounds 25$  for 4 winners plus the premium prize of £50. Subsequently, no longer four score so the new name is now 'Lound Ponv Draw'.

For those non gamblers, a Pony is slang for a £25 bet.

During June, the collectors will be knocking on your door to sell you a 'Lound Pony Draw' ticket for the year starting in July 2023.

You can pay either with cash or cheque made payable to 'Lound Village Hall Committee'. If you prefer, you can pay the £25 by internet banking with the reference being Your Name.
