Huntsman Family of Lound Hall

Part 2 - The backstory to the successful Huntsman family who lived in Lound Hall goes back six generations from Harry. The real success was with Benjamin Huntsman (1704-1776) who was born in Epworth to what is thought to be a Quaker farming family.

Benjamin became a clock maker and moved to Doncaster. He found the steel in the clock components too unreliable and not hard enough, so he started experimenting to make his own steel. This involved making a small clay crucible to hold about 15 kg of iron, heating it beyond melting point, adding charcoal, etc. and keeping it molten for three hours. This was the birth of 'Crucible' cast steel in Sheffield and putting Sheffield as world leader in steel production.

It was harder than any steel that could be bought from around the world.

Harry set up his first steel works at Attercliffe and sold his steel mainly to France to make quality cutlery. The Sheffield cutlers thought it was too hard to work and too expensive to buy.

The French found they could sell the higher quality cutlery to the UK in large numbers, so forcing the Sheffield cutlers into buying the local steel to compete. This was the start of the successful cutlery industry in Sheffield.

Over the decades, the sons of the different generations were taking on and building more steel works and other associated manufacturing industries, including coal mines and so expanding their empire.

From wanting better parts for his clocks, Benjamin Huntsman revolutionised the steel industry and made it a world leader.

There is an example of an original Huntsman longcase clock in Lound and another in the Kelham Island Museum, Sheffield.

PS. Mrs. Huntsman and Mrs. Peglar from Lound helped to fund the building of Sutton cum Lound Village Hall in 1936 and performed the opening ceremony,
