Part 3 — Following on from the story of the Sheffield Steel manufacturers, the Huntsman family, who lived in what is now Lound Hall Nursing Home.......

Another steel magnate also lived in Lound Hall around the middle of the last century. The *Peech* family had become fa-



mous in the world of iron and steel manufacture in Rotherham,

dating back to 1875, when a company was formed by Henry Steel, William *Peech* and Edward Tozer to become **Steel**, **Peech and Tozer**.

The family who lived in Lound Hall were descendants of William *Peech* and still involved in the steel manufacturing of extremely large and heavy machinery. The steel works at one time was the largest in the world using electric arc furnaces.

In the 1960's the steel plant was nationalized by the labour government, twice, but could not make it profitable, hence its gradual decline with lack of investment. Today, all that is left is the huge 'Magna' discovery centre which is housed in one of the main melting shops of the day. **Brian Horne**

The Public Inquiry hearing FCC's appeal against the Environment Agency's position on the proposed Facility to Treat Soil Contaminated with Asbestos at Daneshill is being held at Ye Olde Bell, presided over by the Planning Inspectorate.

The first session (19th-22th March) has seen evidence from the Environment Agency. In the second session (30th April 3rd May) evidence will be heard from the Public and from FCC.
